Mars: Our new home?



The Earth is our home and it has been this way to humans for over 200,000 years. But this may all be about to change. Earth is everything to us, everything we own and do is on Earth. But when you compare it to the universe, we are merely a speck of dust in a vast space above. This therefore poses a question: can our species colonize another planet? A planet similar to ours? Mars?

People like Elon Musk are trying just this because they feel our species needs to be a multi-planet species when ensuring the sustainability of our kind. He argues that without such action, our planet is in danger of being wiped out by disasters such as global warming or a nuclear apocalypse. But why Mars? Scientists believe that Mars is best place for us to go for a number of reasons: First, there have been reports, in recent years, that Mars contains water (the main ingredient for life to survive). With water, poles can form on Mars similar to that on Earth. Its is believed that if this is to happen, then Mars may start forming an atmosphere similar to ours. As well as this, Mars is believed to once have a similar climate to Earth — another victim to global warming.

Other similarities show that Mars has a similar year to us (24 hours 37 mins) and similar seasons. Sounds great right?

Colonizing Mars does however pose some problems. The main problems regard the lack of Oxygen on the planet. Not only does this cause breathing issues, but also stops the possibility of growing plants and keeping livestock. Furthermore, Marsan soil is toxic making agriculture near on impossible! Other issues arise when you consider the temperature on Mars that averages at -80! Rather chilly! Speaking of chilly, Mars is much further away from the Sun than Earth. This means that generating energy on Mars is difficult, you would need ten times the number of solar panels that you would need to produce the amount of energy generated on Earth. Finally, to actually get to Mars is also a challenge. The journey usually takes 333 days however there is a small launch window that can get you there 128. This is due to position of the planet in relation to the Sun and Earth.

Currently, colonizing Mars seems near on impossible. However, with a rapid boost in technology, and the determination of people like Musk, who knows, maybe we will be breathing Marsan air earlier than we first thought? Thanks for reading!





Year 4 had a fantastic time at Bolton Library this week. Take a look at what they got up to...








































Thank you to all of our Nursery parents, who came to this week's story session. It was lovely to see you all and see you joining in with the children.

We have some exciting rewards starting after Christmas for children who read at home regularly!































































































This year we're going to use Seesaw to share our learning. Please join your class today!


