



What is COP26 and why does it matter?



The acronym COP26 is thrown around by the media and politicians, but the term itself hasn't always been clearly defined. COP stands for 'Conference of the Parties.' It is an annual meeting amongst leaders from around world as well as members of the United Nations Framework Conventions on Climate Change (UNFCCC). The UNFCCC was established in 1992 to acknowledge the global threat climate change has to offer. It also aims to create international agreements between world leaders as to how best to tackle the problem in hand. This year's conference of the parties (COP) took place on October 31st 2021 in Glasgow, Scotland. It is the 26th meeting (hence the name!) But why does it all matter?

The climate crisis is a global threat that doesn't care about who you are or what you believe in. The only way to solve such a big problem is to conduct a coordinated global response. This is where

COP26 comes into play. The latest report from the International Panel on Climate Change reveals that the extreme weather events that we are already experiencing (floods, draught and wildfires) are a direct response of climate change and will only get worse if things don't change. According to COP26 organisers, the conference's top goals include making commitments to secure global net zero carbon emissions by 2050 and to keep the goal of reducing global temperatures by 1.5 degrees. By doing this, the UNFCCC guarantee the protection and prevention of habitat destruction and the protection of communities around the world.

However, there has been dispute amongst some of the wealthier countries living on our planet. Arguments have arisen into the fairness of COP26 with some countries arguing that they shouldn't have to invest as much money as others. The US have committed to pledging 11.4 billion dollars into cutting climate change by adopting more environmentally friendly ways of producing energy, and by cutting carbon emissions by 50% before 2030. Other countries have taken a similar stance including Great Britain, Germany and France. However, for COP26 to really make a difference all countries need to play their part. As earlier stated, climate change doesn't care who you are or what you believe in it is a real-life problem that needs all countries to cooperate to ensure the protection of our planet.





Reading




The books for the Half Term Reading Winners have arrived! The children were so excited to receive their new books.
